# **Changes in Adoration Days**

This should give those who are still working a chance to stop on the way home from work and spend time in the presence of our Lord. We will pray the Divine Chaplet and have quiet prayer. We need this now more than ever as we are being physically kept away from Him otherwise.

# **Parents Please Watch Mass With Your Children**

Parents, this is the perfect 'teaching moment'. Gather your children around you and let them know it is time for watching Mass. Tell them that even though we cannot attend Mass in a church, it is still an important part of your weekly routine. Watch Father's Mass on You Tube, discuss the homily, and let them see that this is important enough to carry on even though we cannot be there in person and receive the Holy Eucharist. If you show that it is important to you, it may impress upon them that it should be important to them as well. You can tell them how you miss receiving the Eucharist and how important it is to you. You can discuss how the church building is not the Church. We are the Church. And lastly, discuss just what Jesus' dying on the cross did for us and for all people. Now that's what Easter is all about!

# **PARISH NEWS**

If at any time we cannot go to Mass in or out of this season of the coronavirus, we can still unite ourselves to the Eucharist through making a spiritual Communion. By making an **Act of Spiritual Communion**, we express our faith in Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist and ask him to unite himself with us. We must attempt to bring and keep ourselves as close to Our Lord as we possibly can. If at all possible: Pray the rosary daily, read scripture or some spiritual writing, visit adoration if you feel comfortable doing so on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday from 5-6, watch daily mass, or Sunday mass online with Bishop Barron or watch EWTM, and make a spiritual communion before, during, and after your viewing of the mass, pray for those who are sick and for the health of the Church, pray the Liturgy of the Hours (can be found at ibreviary.org), and please continue to give generously, do penance, and fast when you can. As Jesus once calmed the stormy sea, he will eventually calm this uncertain time. Have faith!

Take a moment to think of the failures of the past week; recall any sins you have committed since your last Communion and offer them to Christ.

## Act of Reception

In union, dear Lord, with the faithful at every altar of thy Church where thy blessed Body and Blood are being offered to the Father, I desire to offer thee praise and thanksgiving. I believe that thou art truly present in the Holy Sacrament. And since I cannot now receive thee

sacramentally, I beseech thee to come spiritually into my heart. I unite myself unto thee, and embrace thee with all the affections of my soul. Let me never be separated from thee. Let me live and die in thy love. Amen.

Come Lord Jesus, dwell in thy servant in the fulness of thy strength, in the perfection of thy ways, and in the holiness of thy spirit, and rule over every hostile power in the might of thy Spirit, and to the glory of thy Father. Amen.

May the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ preserve my body and soul unto everlasting life. Amen.
