

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK—LENTEN INDULGENCES

That phrase above is not one we normally think of with the impending Lenten season. However, I am not meaning excess in food and drink, but the practice of gaining indulgences for souls in our faith. While there are plenty of opportunities to gain a plenary or partial indulgence throughout the year, we should dedicate this time above all to works of charity for the poor souls in need of indulgence from their temporal suffering (remember Purgatory is not eternal but the entry to Heaven and eternal life).

Remember the basics to gain a plenary indulgence: do the act, receive Holy Communion the day of the act, confession within a few weeks, prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father (an Our Father and a Hail Mary are sufficient), and being free of attachment to sin. If any of those are lacking, one can still earn a partial indulgence. These indulgences can be earned for oneself or for the souls in Purgatory.

The usual options that can be done are: recitation of the Rosary as a family or in church, the pious reading of the Scriptures for at least a half hour, and adoration of the Eucharist for at least a half hour. But there is one more indulgence specific to Lent which I wish you to try to do.

THE PRAYER BEFORE THE CRUCIFIX—A plenary indulgence can be gained under the usual conditions when praying this prayer after Communion on Fridays in Lent. The text:

Behold, O kind and most sweet Jesus, I cast myself upon my knees in Your sight, and with the most fervent desire of my soul I pray and beseech You that You would impress upon my heart lively sentiments of Faith, Hope, and Charity, with true repentance for my sins, and a firm purpose of amendment, while with deep affection and grief of soul I ponder within myself and mentally contemplate Your five most precious Wounds; having before my eyes the words which David in prophecy spoke concerning Yourself, O good Jesus: "They have pierced my hands and feet; they have numbered all my bones."

Let us grow in charity not just to those alive with us but even with the holy souls in Purgatory, helping them to reach that which we desire as well: life everlasting. *Fr. Jacob Straub*

CHURCH RULES FOR LENTEN FASTING & ABSTINENCE

FASTING – ASH WEDNESDAY & GOOD FRIDAY

Must be done by all aged 18-59; one main meal; two other lesser meals may be consumed which must not equal as much as one main meal; liquids permitted

ABSTINENCE - ASH WEDNESDAY & ALL FRIDAYS OF LENT

Must be done by all who are at least 14 years old; no consumption of flesh meat (beef, pork, chicken, etc.); seafood (fish, shrimp, shellfish, etc.) permitted

Other circumstances may merit a dispensation from these rules (pregnancy, disease, etc); please talk with Fr. Straub if you have any issues or questions or would like a dispensation from these rules.
