## FROM THE PRIEST - OUR BISHOP

Although I think most of you are aware of all this, I want to take this week's bulletin to discuss an important matter for our diocese. Bishop Roger Foys will turn 75 on Monday, July 27. Upon reaching this date, bishops of the Catholic Church are asked by Church law to submit a letter to the Holy Father on their status. The overwhelming majority of bishops us this letter to request their resignation as the bishop of a diocese or ordinary as it is known in the law. Bishop Foys has made it known that he will request his retirement as bishop of our diocese of Covington.

This does not mean that the letter shall be immediately accepted, nor that a replacement is imminent. As with any bureaucracy, it takes some time for things to be processed and moved forward. There is no time limit upon the Pope to accept a bishop's letter of resignation. This means that we shall still have Bishop Foys as our bishop until such time as the Pope sees fit to accept his resignation and appoint a new bishop.

The unfortunate part about all of this is that we shall be in the dark until perhaps the day before any announcement is made. Much of the process of appointing bishops is rather secretive, which has not helped garner respect for the Church from outside circles in recent years. Not even us priests have any clue when this shall occur or who will be announced. I can only speak based on my knowledge of recent episcopal appointments across the country that we could be waiting almost a year before we hear anything.

What we can do in the mean time is to pray and ask God to send us a holy bishop for our diocese, while offering thanks for Bishop Foys' ministry of 18 years. I am personally thankful to Bishop Foys for supporting my vocation and ordaining me a priest of Jesus Christ. Without Bishop Foys, I would not be here today. It will be very different not having him as our bishop, but I trust in God to give us the bishop we need during these days. To conclude, I offer this prayer from the *Roman Missal* for the election of a bishop. Let us pray for our future bishop!

O God, eternal shepherd,
who govern your flock with unfailing care,
grant in your boundless fatherly love
a pastor for your Church
who will please you by his holiness
and to us show watchful care.
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,
who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, for ever and ever.
