#### **CORONAVIRUS PROTOCOLS**

#### FOR ST. MATTHEW CHURCH

#### Effective June 11, 2020

- 1. Please observe social distancing in the pews. Families may sit together, but please leave the same space between others you do not live with. The ushers will assist you in observing this in-pew distancing.
- 2. Masks may be worn if you feel the need to do so, but they are not required. Be sure to remove your mask if you will receive Holy Communion.
- 3. Holy Communion will be distributed by the priest, with the right side of church going first (from the rear of the church going forward), then the left side of church. Please maintain a proper and safe distance while queueing for Communion.
- 4. You may receive Communion either in the hand or on the tongue. You are <u>NOT OBLIGATED</u> to receive Communion if you feel the risk of spreading or obtaining germs is too great.
- 5. Please do not leave anything in the pews or the supports. Everything will be disposed of or removed after Mass.
- 6. Bishop Foys has issued a general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. If you feel that you cannot attend, you are welcome to stay home and pray. You do not incur any sin in doing this while this dispensation is in effect.
- 7. Volunteers are needed to help sanitize the church after Masses (pews, bathrooms, etc.). Any and all help is greatly appreciated.
- 8. Please stay tuned to the bulletins and any announcements as these things may change over time.
