FROM THE PASTOR—STUDY RESOURCES

If we are going to persist in the practice of our Catholic faith, we must know what we believe and how to live that faith. To serve as a regular reminder of our need to study and know our faith better, I have put together this little list of resources that I have seen be very helpful for so many people and are reliable sources for studying our faith, beyond last week's recommendation of Bible translations. These are either free or at little cost to you. Don't forget the Bible!

PRINT RESOURCES

- *The Catechism of the Catholic Church*—The most reliable work to study the faith since it is published by the Vatican itself! This work contains a very good summary of the basic tenets and beliefs of Catholicism for new members or even for longtime attendees. It can in some places get too deep, but there is no better reference for matters of faith and morals.
- *Compendium of the Catechism*—If you think that reading the *Catechism* may be too difficult, this is a condensed version with references back to the *Catechism*. Feel free to start here!
- *Catholicism and Fundamentalism* by Karl Keating—A classic work on defending the Catholic faith against the charges of Protestants, especially fundamentalist groups such as extreme Baptists; goes over topics such as faith vs works and the place of Scripture in the Church
- *The One Minute Apologist* by Dave Armstrong—A good short work which provides quick answers to many of the objections raised by other Christians.
- *The National Catholic Register*—A regular newspaper published not only with current Church news but also provides many regular discussions and articles on matters of faith and morals (delivered to your home and also available online).

ONLINE RESOURCES

- *WordOnFire.org*—A work started by Bishop Robert Barron with regular series, videos, and articles released on latest issues along with reviewing perennial doctrines and beliefs.
- *Ascension Press*—This is the work of the very popular Fr. Mike Schmitz who has done "Bible in a Year" and "Catechism in a Year" videos and podcasts. There are also other various videos available on YouTube or their website covering lots of good material about the faith.

These are just a few of the things you can find, but they are some of the most reliable that I can promote. Do take advantage of them and learn more about your faith. Let us not settle for the minimum but strive to understand as best as we can so that we may live our faith to the fullest.
