

FROM THE PASTOR – MARCH: MONTH OF ST. JOSEPH

Every month is dedicated to a particular devotion, whether something from the life of Our Lord or someone close to Him. This month is no different, for March is dedicated to devotion to Saint Joseph, the humble carpenter and foster father of the Lord. This originates from the celebration of his particular feast on March 19, held for many centuries on this specific day.

We should first consider the life which this humble saint led as witnessed by the Gospels. Our patron Saint Matthew is our principal source for information, as he focuses the Nativity story on this poor carpenter. Joseph is initially desirous of removing himself from the Blessed Virgin when he discovers she is pregnant with Christ. He humbles himself and desires to back away because he is not worthy to be near such holiness. But the angel of God speaks to him in a dream and tells him to accept the Mother of God and take his growing family to Egypt for a time. The humility of Saint Joseph raises him to great heights before God.

We should behold the humble witness of Saint Joseph in his care for the Holy Family. God entrusted to him the two greatest and holiest people to ever exist: the Immaculate Virgin and the Son of God in the flesh. Joseph fulfilled his duty well, working and providing for his family in his earthly life. He is a model of firm fatherhood needed in such times where fathers are all too often absent.

Finally, we should reflect on what he says: nothing. There is no recorded speech or even a single word spoken by Joseph in the Scriptures. He is a great witness to the power of silence and humility before God and others for all to follow. Let us pray to Saint Joseph for ourselves, for our families, and for the family of our parish. Men should in particular be devoted to such virile example of holiness. St. Joseph, pray for us! Fr. Jacob Straub



CHURCH RULES FOR LENTEN FASTING & ABSTINENCE

FASTING – ASH WEDNESDAY & GOOD FRIDAY

Must be done by all aged 18-59; only one main meal; two other lesser meals may be consumed which must not equal as much as one main meal; liquids permitted

ABSTINENCE – ASH WEDNESDAY & ALL FRIDAYS OF LENT

Must be done by all who are at least 14 years old; no consumption of flesh meat (beef, pork, chicken, etc.); seafood (fish, shrimp, shellfish, etc.) permitted

Other circumstances may merit a dispensation from these rules (pregnancy, disease, etc); please talk with Fr. Straub if you have any issues or questions or would like a dispensation from these rules.
