

FROM THE PASTOR—GUARDIAN ANGELS

Last week, we looked at the entire hierarchy of angels in how they operate as well as the various choirs of angels in Heaven. We should focus our attention this week on those angels which are closest to us: guardian angels. October 2nd is the memorial of these angels specifically tasked to care for us on an individual basis. What are the guardian angels and what is their role in our life?

We hear about this specific choir of angels from Our Lord when He mentions the guardian angels in conjunction with children seeing Christ: "See that you do not despise one of these little ones; for I tell you that in heaven their angels always behold the face of my Father who is in heaven." (Matthew 18:10) It has been consistently taught by the Church that every believer has a guardian angel assigned to them by God even before the person was born. God has looked out for you even before you existed!



The role of the guardian angel is as a protector or watchful eye against the work of Satan and his legions of demons who seek our eternal downfall. God charges this particular angel with spiritual authority to help the believer continue to walk in the light of Christ. We are beset not only by physical and earthly dangers but spiritual dangers as well, and God is on our side to aid us in the long fight of life.

I have heard of people being told or on their own giving names to their angel. We should never do this as each angel has been given a name by God, as well as God placing this angel over us with spiritual authority. We cannot name anything above us, hence we cannot name our angel. Nor should we seek to know their name, for it will be revealed in everlasting life. It is quite easy to refer to our angel by simply praying to them. There is no better prayer than the simple child-like prayer that we should know by heart.

Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love commits me here, ever this day, be at my side, to light, to guard, to rule, to guide. Amen.

Pray every morning to your guardian angel, asking for their protection as you go about your duties. Pray to them every night, that they may protect you while you slumber and remain more vulnerable to temptation. Pray to them for their constant help, so that you may be worthy of joining them in that divine beatific vision which they already enjoy eternally.
