### FROM THE PASTOR—THE ROSARY: THE GLORIOUS MYSTERIES

I would like to take the remainder of this month of the Rosary and offer some points of reflection for the various mysteries. We need to remember that the Rosary is above all a prayer of meditation on the mysteries of the life of Christ and His blessed Mother. To aid with this, I would like to offer some quotes from the various Church fathers on the specific mysteries to provide some fuel for contemplation.

- I. First Glorious Mystery: The Resurrection of the Lord—Pascha means the crossing-over, and so the Festival is called by this name. For it was on this day that the Children of Israel crossed over out of Egypt, and the Son of God crossed over from this world to His Father. What gain is it to celebrate unless you imitate Him Whom you worship; that is, unless you cross over from Egypt, that is, from the darkness of evildoing to the light of virtue, from the love of this world to the love of your heavenly home? (St. Ambrose of Milan)
- II. Second Glorious Mystery: The Ascension of the Lord—For by ascending into heaven He does not desert His adopted; but from above strengthens to endurance, those whom He invites upwards to glory. (St. Leo the Great)
- III. Third Glorious Mystery: The Descent of the Holy Spirit—They partook of fire, not of burning but of saving fire; of fire which consumes the thorns of sins, but gives luster to the soul. This is now coming upon you also, and that to strip away and consume your sins which are like thorns, and to brighten yet more that precious possession of your souls, and to give you grace; for He gave it then to the Apostles. (St. Cyril of Jerusalem)
- IV. Fourth Glorious Mystery: The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary—You are she who, as it is written, appears in beauty, and your virginal body is all holy, all chaste, entirely the dwelling place of God, so that it is henceforth completely exempt from dissolution into dust. Though still human, it is changed into the heavenly life of incorruptibility, truly living and glorious, undamaged and sharing in perfect life. (St. Germanus of Constantinople)
- V. Fifth Glorious Mystery: The Coronation of Mary as Queen of Heaven & Earth—His evervirgin Mother, from whose womb He, being God, took on human form, He today transports from earthly dwellings as Queen of the human race... The Queen of the entire human race faithful in reality to the meaning of her name, who is exalted above all things save only God himself. (St. Andrew of Crete)

Pray well these mysteries and rejoice that Christ has risen to conquer all things, including sin and death, and open the way for you to receive a share in everlasting life with the Queen of Heaven and all the angels and saints forever.
