FROM THE PASTOR—CURRENT ISSUES: SEXUAL IDENTITY

The quickest trend to transform the political landscape has been the various alphabet agenda trends, the LGBT+ assembly. There is so much to address with this topic that it must be divided and conquered in its constituent parts. Before we can attack the individual items of this agenda, we must understand what is fueling this change: the concept of sexual identity.

The root of such things as homosexuality and transgenderism is the idea that we are only sexual creatures. What is meant by this is that we are primarily whatever we are attracted to, whatever satisfies our carnal pleasures. There is no other means of self-identity than this: it ranks above religion, nationality, even race. An individual who has been manipulated by sexual identity theory only sees themselves as a sexual creature, as one who can only find meaning and satisfaction in the sexual and physical. This means that they only see others also in their sexual identity, reducing us to a mere object weighed upon its pleasurability towards themselves.

This must be understood as more than an orientation. While too many in this agenda may use the term "sexual orientation", that is not deep enough to name how this is treated. When homosexuals demand marriage rights and rights to children, they are not seeking acceptance of an orientation but an acknowledgement of identity. When transgenders demand you see them for the gender they wish to be and push for health care for their surgeries, this is not some flippant orientation that can be switched on or off or ignored, but a deep-set identification with oneself in this particular identity.

The exaltation of the sexual identity as the only identity betrays a misunderstanding of the human person as created and constituted by God. It cannot be denied that we have a sexual identity in that we are capable of expressing ourselves in a sexual manner (whether in a holy or sinful manner is a different issue), which sees its fulfillment in the conjugal act between husband and wife. However, we are far more than our sexual identity, far more than our urges.

Scripture reveals that we are created in the image and likeness of God and as such receive a great dignity as not only being creatures of God but oriented towards recreation in Christ to truly be sons of God. In Christ, we see how it is we can love beyond merely the erotic. We are not merely creatures defined by sex but are far more and far greater than that. The call of chastity is issued to all: chastity which is the proper appreciation and use of the sexual gift one has received in one's vocation, whether married or single or celibate.

We as Catholics oppose the alphabet agenda because we are not oriented only or primarily or even only towards sex. We hold not only the witness of so many pure and chaste saints throughout our history but even Christ Himself who remained celibate in His earthly life and called all who could to follow Him. May we bear witness to the love of Christ for all who struggle with sexual identity and may we bear witness to the truth of the Gospel to all people. *Fr. Jacob Straub*
