

FROM THE PASTOR—THE CHOIRS OF ANGELS

This week sees the feast of the Holy Archangels on September 29: the celebration of the archangels Michael, Raphael, and Gabriel, whose impact has been seen not just in the Bible but throughout history. This is a good opportunity to consider the angelic order overall, their importance and their impact on us. To describe an angel first is to say that they are spiritual creatures: they do not possess a physical body, but exist similar to God in a spiritual, non-physical manner. They have greater intellects and powers than we do, especially given their ability to travel great distances at incredible speeds.

We call them *angels* from the Greek *angelos* which means "messenger" and this most accurately describes them for they are the messengers of God throughout the universe. It must also be noted that angels (as well as demons, which are condemned angels) are incapable of change: once they have fixed their will for or against God, they cannot alter their will unlike human beings who can change their mind.

There are said to be nine choirs of angels in the hierarchy of Heaven, divided into three spheres or triads of operation and oversight.



First Sphere-concerned with the worship and glory of God; the three choirs in here are the Thrones, Cherubim, and Seraphim

> Second Sphere-concerned with the operation of the universe; the three choirs in here are the Dominations, Virtues, and Powers

Third Sphere-focus on the life of man; the three choirs here are Angels (including guardian angels), Archangels, and Principalities

All the choirs do the work assigned to them promptly, without hesitation, and joyfully. They remind us how we should be in our service of God. They also enjoy the Beatific Vision, that is they see God face to face and communicate directly with Him. They are what we wish to become after this life. Let us pray to them, and especially the Holy Archangels this week, that we may serve God in this life so as to rejoice with Him and all the angels and saints forever in the next life.
